Explanation of Classes and Eligibility Requirements

Some Useful Terms.....

"Equitation" means that the judge will attempt to rate the riders' position, control, and understanding of good riding principles.

"Hunter" means that the judge will consider the horse's performance, soundness, manners, and way of going.

"O/F" means over fences--these are jumping classes.

Class #	Class Name	Class Description
1	Short Stirrup Equitation Walk/Trot, diagonals not to count	"Short Stirrup" classes are open to beginning riders who are eleven years old or younger. Riders will perform together as a group, except where noted. Riders who compete in the Short Stirrup Equitation division at this show may NOT also compete in the Novice Equitation division at this show, but may at future shows.
2	Short Stirrup Equitation Walk/Trot, diagonals to count	
3	Short Stirrup Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter, one at a time	
4	Slalom Race	A "course" of gates will be set up, and riders must weave between them to the end of the ring and back. The fastest rider wins, but missing a gate or knocking it over will penalize you 4 seconds, so be careful!
5	Around the World Contest	All riders will go "around the world" at the same time. The first person to clearly win 5 contests will be declared the overall winner. Riders who kick or touch the horse with their feet and/or legs will be disqualified.
6	Novice Equitation Walk/Trot	Novice Equitation is open to riders of all ages who consider themselves novices, but who are NOT also competing in the Short Stirrup or the Open division at this horse show. Champion and reserve champion ribbons will be awarded to riders who have the highest scores overall in the Novice Equitation division (classes 6, 7, 8, 15 and 16).
7	Novice Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter (one at a time)	
8	Novice Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter	
9	Open Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter	Riders of all ages and abilities may compete in the Open division (classes 9, 17, 18 and 19). They will perform as a group, and riders may be asked to execute such "tests" as halting, sitting the trot, riding without stirrups, etc. This is our most advanced flat class. Champion and reserve champion ribbons will be awarded.
10	Talent Class	Do you have a talent that involves a horse? If so, this is the class for you! The rider who most impresses the judge will be the winner.
11	Training Level Dressage Test 1	Riders in these classes will perform USDF Training Level Dressage Tests 1 and/or 2. To be judged on forward motion, accuracy, position, and quality of gait.
12	Training Level Dressage Test 2	
13	Team Contest Scavenger Hunt & Relay Race	There is no entry fee for this class, and it does not count as one of your four classes that are included in your entry fee. Riders will be divided into teams, in which they will perform an assortment of tasks and races in order to determine a winner. This fun class will be the highlight of the show! Riders of all levels are strongly encouraged to participate.
14	Hunter Hack WTC & 2 jumps	In this old school class, riders will demonstrate the walk, trot, and canter together as a group, and then will jump two jumps. To be judged on the horse's performance, manners, and way of going.
15	Novice Equitation O/F Crossrails	Novice classes are open to riders of all ages who consider themselves to be novices and who wish to compete in jumping classes over small, welcoming jumps. Equitation classes are judged on the rider, and hunter classes are judged on the horse.
16	Novice Hunter O/F Crossrails	
17	Open Equitation O/F 2'0"-3'6"	Riders of all ages and abilities may compete in the Open division, but Open riders may NOT also compete in the Novice or the Short Stirrup divisions. A champion and reserve champion ribbon will be awarded. Riders jump the height that they usually practice at home. "Handy" courses may require riders to execute rollback turns, bending lines, trot jumps, and other challenges that can arise in the hunt field.
18	Open Hunter O/F 2'0"-3'6"	
19	Open Handy Hunter O/F 2'0"-3'6"	
20	Rider's Challenge Class Jumps not to exceed 2'6"	Open to all riders who are capable of jumping a 2'6" course, without difficulty, and who feel like being challenged.
21	Open Jumper Table 2.2b Stay in for J/O, 2'0"-3'6"	The fastest one with the fewest number of faults wins. 4 faults will be assigned to each refusal or the knock-down of one or more rails.
22	Open Jumper Table 2.2c Power and Speed, 2'0"-3'6"
